met, by Chair Brad Pierce. He announced he had appointed Jamie Hartig to serve as Secretary in the absence of

- 2. APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA: On the motion of Amy Holland, duly seconded, the agenda was approved.
- 3. PUBLIC COMMENT: None.
- 4. **CONSENT AGENDA:** The consent agenda included the June 5, 2019 draft minutes, and a treasurer's report as of July 3, 2019, which showed a balance of 16, 576.73. On the motion of Tom Dougherty, duly seconded, the Consent Agenda was approved.
- 5. ITEM(S) REMOVED FROM CONSENT AGENDA: None.

6. COMMITTEE REPORTS:

- A. <u>COMMUNITY OUTREACH</u> Melissa Coudeyras reported that the committee is looking for a new website designer. They are creating and sending out the RFP in August and will have until September for applicants to submit proposals. The committee is looking to revamp the website with the hopes that the committee can go in and upload minutes and agendas themselves. The draft RFP will go out to Roundtable before being released. The Roundtable vote to select the designer will be in October.
- B. <u>FLY QUIET</u> Don Kuskie presented for the committee. The committee had no updates. However, the committee discussed entry gates signage so that the pilots that come through there will see the signs. Creating a simple sign, to be placed right under the time-card reader should capture the attention of pilots who are not informed about the Noise Abatement Guidelines.
- C. <u>NOISE MONITORS</u> Tom Dougherty presented. The committee had nothing to report. The committee was going to go to the DIA control tower however, the appointment was cancelled.
- D. The May 2019 Noise Report was presented by Dylan Heberlein. It showed there had been 30,062 total operations in May, for a total of 136, 480 operations in the first 5 months of the year.

In May there had been 409 complaints from 50 households.

133 complaints had come from Unincorporated Arapahoe County (33%); 79 complaints had come from Centennial (19%); 33 were from Unincorporated Douglas County (8%); 70 from Greenwood Village (17%); 45 from Aurora (11%); 13 from Lone Tree (3%); 7 were from Castle Pines (2%), 6 were from Highlands Ranch (1%); 12 were from Parker (3%); 3 were from Denver (1%); and 7 were from Other (2%). Of those, there had been responses requested from 15 email complaints and 10 telephone complaints.

Year to date, there had been 1,575 complaints from 110 households:

The highest number of complaining households were: 25 from Unincorporated Arapahoe County; 17 from Greenwood Village; 15 from Unincorporated Douglas County; 10 from Highlands Ranch; 8 from Centennial; 8 from Lone Tree; 7 from Denver; 6 from Other; 5 from Parker; and 3 from Aurora.

Of those households, 401 complaints were from the 25 in Unincorporated Arapahoe County; 365 were from the 8 in Centennial; 334 complaints had come from the 15 located in Unincorporated Douglas County; 165 came from 3 in Aurora; 132 were from 17 in Greenwood Village; 83 were from the 8 households in Lone Tree; 26 came from 5 in Parker; 23 came from 10 in Highlands Ranch; 17 came from 7 households in Denver; and 21 came from 6 in Other.

YTD, the top five complaining households came from Centennial, Unincorporated Douglas County, Unincorporated Arapahoe County, Aurora, and Lone Tree.

Of the 409 May complaints, 374 were about <u>daytime flights</u> and 35 were about <u>nighttime flights</u>. YTD, 1,406 of the complaints were about daytime flights and 169 were about nighttime flights.

<u>Props</u> had accounted for 44% of the complaints; <u>jets</u> accounted for 50% of the complaints; <u>helicopters</u> were 1%; and 5% were unknown. <u>Departures</u> were responsible for 53% of the complaints; <u>arrivals</u> were 27%; <u>training</u> was 12%; <u>overflights</u> were 2%; and 6% were unknown.

The May complaint map showed the locations of the complaints, with four being outside the map boundaries, in Franktown, Elizabeth, Jefferson County, and Denver.

Question about never seeing complaints from Castle Pines but this month there had been 7 complaints. Dylan explained that is was a one time event from a Make a Wish Foundation flight that happened to be over Castle Pines.

Question about a Bonanza plane that triggered multiple noise events. Dylan explained it flew directly over the noise monitor and may have been set for climb.

Question if any preliminary complaints in June have increased due to the DIA runway closure, Dylan answered that they have a seen an increase but will have a final number next month.

Question was asked if it was normal for Lone Tree to have events over 90 Db. Dylan explained that he would research further and it could have been either military or a combination of a plane and a close-by interference.

Question if the portable monitor has been used, it has not. Question of how many we have? There are two. Would it be beneficial to get another one? A discussion was held on the characteristics of the noise monitors, such as size and cost and instances where they have been used. Airport staff explained how the airport asks developers to complete a noise study.

- D. <u>WORK PLAN</u> : Brad Pierce presented: the committee is working on the annual report and orientation manual, the committee will meet again this month, and presented to the roundtable that there is an outside source that is available if any of the committees need monetary or staff assistance
- E. <u>STUDY GROUP</u> Brad Pierce presented. Still neede the signed MOU and funding structure and payment from Castle Rock. The original signed MOU form is still needed from Arapahoe County. The study group will start to work on the bylaws.

8. OTHER REGULAR MONTHLY REPORTS:

- A. ARAPAHOE COUNTY PUBLIC AIRPORT AUTHORITY Robert Doubek reported:
 - A motion was made and approved to accept the ACPAA Financial Statements for years ending December 31, 2018 and 2017.

- Non-Objection and approval were made for VF Corporation's Hangar/Office Concept Plan. The proposed facility will have a total building area of 54,542 square feet. Included will be a 34,850 sq. ft. hangar, 14,351 sq. ft. office and 5,340 sq. ft. garage. VF anticipates storing up to four large business aircraft in the facility.
- A motion was made and approved to adjourn to Executive Session concerning approval of the proposed buyer of the Centennial Hotel, LLC leasehold.

B. AIRPORT DIRECTOR'S REPORT - Robert Olislagers reported:

- Centennial will be closing a runway for 5 days or less to seal coat the runway weather permitting, from July 15 to 19, 2019. The airport is prohibiting touch and go operations from flight schools while it is closed. A lot more concentrated traffic will be going through the runway that is open.
- C. <u>METROPLEX</u> Centennial Airport's letter was filed to the FAA on June 5. Legal counsel filed a petition for review for further review of the Environmental Impact statement regarding the Metroplex project. by the FAA, and asked surrounding jurisdictions to support. The airport is requesting a 20-year projection of operations due to the 1% growth that DIA has been experiencing the past few years.
- D. **NEXTGEN ADVISORY COMMITTEE (NAC)** Brad Pierce will be attending the July 31 NAC meeting.
- E. N.O.I.S.E. Brad noted that the next N.O.I.S.E. meeting is November 20 in San Antonio, Texas.

- A. <u>2019 CACNR REPRESENTATIVES TO ACPAA</u> There is no time to write a report for the next August 8 ACPAA Board Meeting so a verbal update will have to be given. A representative is still pending for the August 8 meeting.
